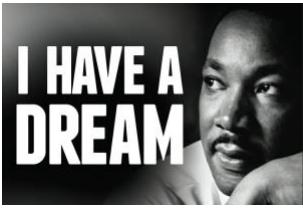

Highlight on Martin Luther King Jr. Day Jan. 18th, 2021

What is the significance of this day and why do we celebrate it?

Martin Luther King, Jr. was a son, a husband, a father, a minister and a civil rights leader. He led through example and worked to bring people together, and to fight for civil rights using a model of dialog and peaceful protest. His legacy reminds us all to **Dream Big!**

Though the fight for a holiday recognizing the significance of his contributions took years, in January 1986 it was first celebrated as a federal holiday. It was not until 2000 that every state in the union finally observed the holiday. In more recent years, finding a way to provide service has become a fundamental characteristic of this day.
