Message from Mrs. Taylor to Our Community

The image of children and staff returning to school will be one of my most treasured memories of Beechwood. Almost a year to the day, students crossed the threshold of our main gate and with them returned the joy of being in the classroom. So often over the past year I have seen examples of us taking care of each other: helping with groceries, to picking-up books/materials for a friend, to a teacher reaching out to a student to check-in, leaving a note for a teacher. This has been the most challenging period of time I have ever experienced professionally, and I humbly thank you for your patience as we navigate this shifting landscape.

I also want to acknowledge and honor the diverse group of people that make-up our parent, student and teaching community. Beechwood is a place where we want to acknowledge our differences and be ready to learn about each other. Whether it is our first languages, our hair textures, our skin tones, or even the books we read, we need to continue to build a safe place where our children feel secure and experience kindness.

Last week, the tragic events in Atlanta reminded me that we need to make sure all members of our community are heard and included. I want to state clearly to all of you, and especially members of our Asian American Pacific Island Communities that our school is committed to an environment that is tolerant of others where we respect our cultural differences. Acting toward any segmented group in a violent or intolerant way is not supported at this school. We are committed to instilling our students with the life skills they need to become healthy, caring adults in a world that could benefit from more kindness and respect.

We encourage our parents to continue this dialog at home, reminding children that it is not our job to judge others, but rather to learn to respect differences. At its most basic, our hope is that our students treat others with kindness, respect and understanding.
