Hispanic Heritage Month

September 15-October 15



We have a diverse and vibrant community at Beechwood School. Hispanic Heritage Month is an important opportunity to explore, learn and share about Latino culture. In addition to resources shared via the newsletter, we expect to celebrate both in and outside of classrooms.

- Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month from September 15 to October 15, by celebrating the histories, cultures and contributions of American citizens whose ancestors came from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean and Central and South America.
- The day of September 15th is significant because it is the anniversary of independence for Latin American countries Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. In addition, Mexico and Chile celebrate their independence days on September 16th and September 18th, respectively. Also, Columbus Day or Día de la Raza, which is October 12, falls within this 30 day period.
